

## **Graduate Study Abroad Programs**

### **2018-19 Academic Year**

The information here pertains to the four Study Abroad programs that are open to full-time MBA, PMBA and Healthcare MBA students. Students in the Energy MBA and MS-Supply Chain Management programs should reference details relative to their cohort-specific trips [here](#).

#### **I. Costs:**

For each course, three credit hours of tuition and a program fee (listed below) will be charged.

Seating is limited for each trip. Please refer to each trip's website for maximum number of students. The first students to pay in full (via credit card) and register will be granted a position on their desired trip until the maximum number is met. Fees are:

- 750 for initial trip (the Graduate Programs office automatically grants a \$1,650 waiver)
  - \$2,400 for second trip
  - \$2,400 for guest
- A. **Generally**, the program fee covers hotel (during the days the program is scheduled), breakfast each day, special meals/trips/events, textbooks and materials, faculty costs, etc. It does not include airfare/transportation, meals not referenced above, or other expenses incurred while in country.
- B. The program fee assumes that hotel rooms will be shared by two students in the program. Students opting for a private room will incur a supplemental charge.

#### **II. Course Prerequisites**

A. Courses are open to all MBA, PMBA and Health Care MBA students in good standing, and each course carries three semester hours of credit.

B. Students must have completed and received a passing grade in BUSI 60050, Global Environment of Business, in order to participate in any of the study abroad courses. For all students, BUSI 60050 is part of the required core course schedule during the initial summer or fall term.

#### **III. Eligibility for a second trip**

Students may receive academic credit for only one study abroad experience.

#### **IV. Guests.**

Prior to registration, students who are considering taking a guest should check with faculty for the trip to determine the extent to which guests may participate.

As noted above, there is a fee of \$2,400 per guest that must be paid in full at the time of registration.

Only one guest is allowed and the guest must be 18 years or older.

## **V. Information.**

Students are encouraged to attend the Global Experience Fair from 5:00-6:30 p.m. on September 24, 2018 in Rees-Jones Hall 351. Faculty trip leaders and past student participants will share information and answer questions regarding individual trips. A casual dinner will be provided.

VI. **Registration and Payment.** On **Monday, Oct. 1st**, online trip registration will open. Each trip has a limited capacity and spots will be filled on a first-come, first-served basis.

- A. Full payment, via credit card, is required in order to register.
- B. Students should not register to visit a country in which they were born or have extensive experience.
- C. **Refunds.** All fees are nonrefundable.

## **VII. Travel Arrangements**

Students should not purchase flight tickets or make other irrevocable travel arrangements prior to receiving communication from the faculty member(s) leading the trip.
